

I was going to await the launch of our new website before sending this message, but I didn't want to further delay sharing news with you. Here's the current status of our organization.

At the First Segmented Symposium, held at the Marc Adams School (marcadams.com) in November 2008, the attendees expressed a strong desire that we form a "specialty" chapter within the AAW.

And then at the AAW Albuquerque Symposium in June 2009, almost 100 interested segmenters met and

voted to form a chapter. Many decisions were discussed, officers were nominated, and votes were taken. The minutes of that meeting are included in this newsletter.

We have a terrific board in place, and I look forward to working with everyone. The board positions are held by:

In addition, we are very fortunate to have Dennis Daudelin as our Webmaster and Sharon Bierman as our Newsletter Editor.

With suggestions from other board members, I submitted our bylaws to the AAW, and those bylaws have been approved. We are now an official chapter of the AAW.

An internet committee consisting of Dennis Daudelin, Lloyd Johnson, and Sharon Bierman has been formed, and, with their expertise, our website is being completely rebuilt. The website will have public and members-only sections. The public will be able to view newsletters, galleries, links, calendar of events, and symposium information. Dues-paying members (\$25 annually) will have complete access to members' galleries, Q&As, the forum, techniques, tips & tricks, collaboration, instruction, articles, videos, product reviews, and other resources, etc.

Member registration and dues collection will begin after Dennis and his committee have finished the website upgrade.

We need a logo. I am challenging everyone who has a knack for this sort of thing to submit your ideas to malcolm@tahoeturner.com. In addition to the honor, there could be a very nice prize for the winning entry.

We have begun planning for our next symposium, and the first major decisions are where and when. If you have any preferences, please participate in the survey (see back cover).

the organizational meeting

The organizational meeting at Albuquerque NM (June 26, 2009) was dedicated to the formation of Segmented Woodturners as an AAW international chapter. The following items were proposed, moved, seconded, and approved by those AAW members attending.

It was agreed to form an international chapter of the AAW (the "Chapter"), to be known as the "Segmented Woodturners." Membership in the AAW will be encouraged but not required for membership in the Chapter. The annual dues will be \$25 U.S.

Officers were nominated and elected by acclamation. Positions filled by appointment were Webmaster and Newsletter Editor. (All positions are listed on the last page of this newsletter, with contact information.)

Meetings - The annual meetings will be held at the AAW symposiums. Future segmented turning symposiums will be held from time to time (separate from the AAW symposiums), with dates, times, and locations to be determined.

Membership Communications - Currently, all outgoing communications from the leadership will be sent to individuals who are registered at segmentedwoodturners.org. That website will include a picture-



posting area so members can share their work. The need for a discussion forum similar to the AAW or WOW was discussed but not resolved.

Bylaws - The first draft of the bylaws should be completed by Malcolm Tibbetts at the end of July. A document would circulate for comments and recommendations. Bylaw elements included officer terms of 2 years, total uninterrupted time on the Board not to exceed 4 years, and legal structure (LLC, 501(c)3, etc.) and organizational purpose to be defined. Scott Fruchter offered to provide legal review of the bylaws. •
